1.0 CALL TO ORDER: SELPA Administrator Dr. Patty Metheny called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m. at the Dorothy Inghram Learning Center located at 670 E. Carnegie Drive, San Bernardino, CA 92408.

2.0 PUBLIC COMMENTS: There were no public comments.

3.0 REVIEW/APPROVAL OF MINUTES: The minutes of the May 18, 2023, meeting were reviewed. Motion to approve the minutes was made by Patricia Buchmiller and seconded by Rob Pearson. The minutes were approved by consensus of the members present.

## 4.0 DISCUSSION/PRESENTATION

### Finance Items

#### 4.1 EV SELPA Proportionate Share Programs

Dr. Metheny, in Andrea Tennyson's absence, presented the EV SELPA Proportionate Share Programs student count and fees as of May 23, 2023. Dr. Metheny observed this document details student count, percentage of cost by district, and total cost of the programs.

#### 4.2 SBCSS Fee-for-Service

Dr. Metheny shared the SBCSS Fee-for-service cost. The report contained student count per district and cost per service. Dr. Metheny remarked these numbers were verified by the special education directors after the May Steering Committee meeting. Final numbers will be an average of March and May student counts this year.

#### 4.3 EV SELPA 2022-2023 Fiscal Reporting Calendar

Dr. Metheny reviewed fiscal activities for the month of June.

#### 4.4 EV SELPA 2023-2024 Fiscal Reporting Calendar

Dr. Metheny reviewed activities for the months of July and August. The next Steering and Finance Committee meeting will be August 17, 2023. Dr. Metheny remarked that an updated Schedule Rex may be ready in July and if so, it will be sent to the districts.

### Program Items

#### 4.5 EV SELPA 2022-2023 Collaborative Professional Development

Program Specialists Courtney Beatty and Shannon Vogt provided a review of professional development provided in 2022-2023. They shared the East Valley SELPA adjusted its training approach in response to the substitute shortage in district and the lack of attendees for trainings offered at the SELPA. This change created an opportunity for more in-district staff development, allowed for more capacity building among district staff, led to the development of onsite teams to brainstorm on specific classroom problems, allowed creation of a new teacher networking, and offer overall flexibility based on specific district needs. A catalog of trainings available within this model was shared along with a revised d EV-23 to request program specialist services.

#### 4.6 EV SELPA OT Proportionate Share Program

Dr. Metheny provided data regarding the significant increase in assessment requests for occupational therapy. For the 2022-2023, 160 requests for initial assessments were received and conducted with only an average of 56% of students qualifying for OT services. For this reason, the East Valley SELPA hire two contract OTs via staffing agencies using Medi-Cal funds. However, this practice is not sustainable as Medi-Cal funds can't be used indefinitely for this purpose but only in response to the influx of requests due to the COVID pandemic. The directors commented that they are also experiencing this influx of referrals as a direct result of the COVID pandemic across



several disciplines. Given this, Dr. Metheny provided a projection of funding for OT services costs into 2024-2025 that will impact the OT Proportionate Share program costs. Training for school personnel on sensory needs was discussed as a way to curb the number of referrals for occupational therapy.

#### 4.7 2023-24 EV SELPA NPS Master Contract

The 2023-2024 EV SELPA NPS Master Contract was presented. There are no changes to this agreement from previous year. The Inland Empire SELPA Administrators continues to negotiate rates with the regional Nonpublic Schools. Dr. Metheny observed that some of the daily rates negotiated now include the daily lunch rate for students and districts only pay for positive attendance.

#### 4.8 EV SELPA Private School Individual Service Plan Services

Dr. Homutoff hosted the annual private school consultation meeting in May and reported only two private schools in attendance. At the meeting, he provided information to the private schools regarding funding and services available for students placed in private schools by their parents. Collectively, the directors decided to continue providing services to the private schools in the East Valley SELPA region in the form of 90 minutes of consultation annually.

#### 4.9 EV SELPA IEP Implementation Module

The first data submission to CDE for the IEP implementation monitoring has been completed well in advance of the June 30 deadline. At the moment, it is not clear what activities or corrective actions CDE will impose after reviewing said data. Once the activities or corrective actions are specified SELPA will be available to assist. Jennifer Brooksby shared only one district has submitted the LEA assurance form distributed last Steering Committee Meeting. She asks for the LEA assurance forms to be sent to her as soon as possible. Ms. Brooksby also reminded the directors the provider assurance form, also distributed at the last Steering Committee meeting, should be kept at the district level. Finally, Ms. Brooksby suggested re-checking the service log data collected in the WebIEP implementation module to ensure the calculations are accurate. Accurate records retention should be a priority as there could be a record request.

#### 4.10 EV SELPA Inclusion & Review Session

The culminating event for the Zooming In and Zooming Out series held at the EV SELPA in May was a success. However, because of a scheduling conflict, the campfire chat with Katie Novak and Shelley Moore had to be postponed. It is scheduled now for June 12 here at the SELPA. There will a Zoom option if in-person attendance is not possible. Jennifer Brooksby reminded the directors the Inclusion Grant expenditure reports are due to her June 30, 2023.

#### 4.11 CDE Compliance & Improvement Monitoring (CIM)

The required Compliance and Monitoring (CIM) plans have been submitted to CDE. All information pertaining to the CIM plans is stored in the Google drive managed, and shared with the directors, by Jennifer Brooksby. Ms. Brooksby recommends keeping a binder with sign-in sheets and other information that CDE may request. The link will be re-sent to the directors after this meeting.

The student record review data that needs to be available to CDE must be labeled by SSID number. All files must be identified in this manner. The link to this Google drive where these documents are uploaded will be re-sent to the directors after this meeting as well.

The NPS monitoring visits are due to CDE by June 30, 2023. Jennifer Brooksby urged the directors to complete those visits as soon as possible.

#### 4.12 CALPADS/Student Data

End-of-Year 3 and 4 certification deadlines are July 28. The amendment window, to correct any errors, will begin July 29 and end August 25, 2023. As reported by Ms. Sonya Cain, most districts have reached out to her to assist with errors with the exception of East Valley Operations. A PowerPoint presentation to assist with the End-of-Year Submission was shared.

Ms. Cain reported requests to reopen IEPs filed to history have increased exponentially in the last few weeks. These requests are to change or correct services that must be done through the amendment process. To assist with this process, any requests to reopen IEPs will be directed to the special education directors for approval. Finally, Ms. Cain will communicate the final DRDP submission.

#### 4.13 2023-24 AAC Certificate PD Option

A flyer for an AAC Certificate opportunity was presented. Given the increase in requests for assistive technology it was advised to send at least two speech pathologists per district. Jennifer Johnson shared that Rialto staff have gone through this certification and can attest to its value. EV SELPA has requested to host a similar training provided by the LA Diagnostic Center but the current waiting list for this training has the East Valley SELPA scheduled in the Spring of 2025.

#### 4.14 EV SELPA Parent Resource Fair

Dr. Metheny shared the East Valley SELPA is planning a parent resource fair to connect parents of special needs students with resources in the community and experts in the special education realm. Suggestions for vendors, community resources or activities for this fair were welcome. Planning for this fair will commence this summer.

#### 4.15 SBCSS East Valley Operations

Dr. Wyatt shared the work of the VI workgroup continues. They are collecting data and worksheets to distribute to subgroups to analyze the level of service and staffing needed.

Patti Buchmiller and Leslie Burghardt expressed the need to have procedures in place for students graduating from County programs. Extraordinary measures were taken for a student placed in a county program to participate in the graduation ceremony last night. Dr. Wyatt will work on creating procedures for students graduating in county classrooms.

Dr. Wyatt will also contact the directors in July regarding the survey for a potential moderate-severe classroom for elementary students and report to the directors on any possible classrooms moving or relocating. Rob Pearson expressed the need for early notification of any classroom changes as transportation needs to be notified.

#### 4.16 Hot Topics

Language regarding the Alternative Pathway to High School diploma was included in the Trailer Bill for the Governor's approval. If approved, the language specified in the Trailer Bill will be added to all students' IEPs.

Dr. Wyatt shared that SBCSS East Valley Operations will work with district staff to create a notification system to include County students in district campus in graduation activities, ceremonies, and award certificates of completion. Dr. Wyatt also shared that other County policies and procedures will be revised during the summer.

Patti Buchmiller shared the parent group advised by David Dowling is currently working under the PTA umbrella but soon will become part of the SPCTA. Ms. Buchmiller is hopeful the special education advisory committee in Redlands may merge with the SPCTA. Dr. Metheny anticipates inviting this group to participate in the parent resource fair.

Patti Buchmiller also shared that the number of special education students in Redlands continues to increase. She is hopeful that training on RTI interventions will be helpful for teachers to assist in the proper identification. This will be very valuable, in particular for new teachers.

Jennifer Johnson inquired as to the type of incident a Behavior Emergency Report (BER) is required to be sent to the district. A discussion ensued and for every prone restraint a BER is necessary. After a BER is received, the IEP team must meet and review to ensure the current goals are appropriate. This review may lead to a Functional Behavior Assessment (FBA) for the student. Jennifer Johnson would like a black and white definition of prone restrain based on PCM techniques.

Dr. Wyatt will report back regarding a potential EBD program for younger students in the region.

The East Valley SELPA, on behalf of its member districts, contracts with nonpublic schools (NPS) and residential facilities. NPS expenditures are brokered through the SELPA office and via the regional Inland Empire SELPA Association (IESA). In addition, the EV SELPA processes all related invoices and provides payments on behalf of its member districts. All NPS contract costs for tuition, mental health services and residential placements, per the students' IEPs, are paid by the EVSELPA on behalf of the districts. The EV SELPA bills the districts on a quarterly basis for all actual costs paid. The EV SELPA reports the quarterly billing transfers in regularly scheduled EV SELPA Steering Committee meetings and provides quarterly comprehensive NPS reporting to the EV SELPA Board of Directors.

## Assembly Bill 1172 Requirements

AB1172 requires each NPS/A to provide annual behavior training to all staff that encounter students during the school day. The NPS/A is required to provide to the EV SELPA evidence of the training. The EV SELPA reviews the documentation and provides the verification to any NPS/As with which EV SELPA holds the contract on behalf of its member districts. If an individual LEA holds a contract with an NPA independent of the EV SELPA, the LEA will review the documentation and provide the verification.

AB1172 requires that the LEA conduct an annual monitoring visit for each student placed at an NPS. The annual monitoring includes student observation, facility walk-through/visit, and review of student progress toward goals. The LEA conducts the annual monitoring using the designated EV SELPA form and submits the form to the EV SELPA when completed. EV SELPA submits the forms to CDE on behalf of its member districts and maintains a database to ensure all placed students are reviewed annually. EV SELPA conducts the annual monitoring visit for each student placed in a residential facility.

### California Department of Education, Special Education Division NPS Monitoring

Non-public schools are cycled through a regular series of on-site reviews and self-reviews by CDE every three years. SELPAs who hold a Master Contract with a NPS and LEAs with students enrolled in the NPS are notified of planned on-site reviews as well as “unannounced visits.” It is the practice of the East Valley SELPA to be present at each of these meetings.

Based on CDE reviews there are four certification ratings for a Nonpublic School:

1. Approved – no restrictions
2. Conditional – indicating some level of CDE support, oversight, and required corrective actions
3. Suspension – may not take new students
4. Revocation – unable to accept Special Education dollars for placement but may continue to operate as a private school

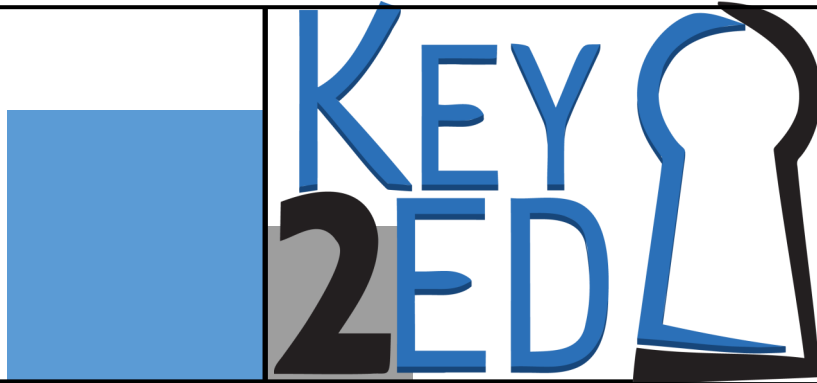

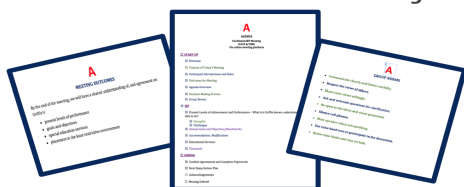

# Required DRDP Assessor Training for Special Education Guidance for Administrators

The California Department of Education, Special Education Division, requires annual DRDP training for all early childhood special educators who assess children with the DRDP.

- SELPAs are responsible for ensuring that all staff who administer the DRDP complete training.
- All required training is accessed through [DRAccessLearn.org](https://draccesslearn.org).
- When creating an account with [DR Access Learn](https://draccesslearn.org), assessors should make sure to select the correct District and SELPA to ensure their training progress goes to the correct SELPA.

*Note: The DR Access Learn account login is unique and not associated with other Desired Results Access Project logins such as DR Access Reports.*

Three online courses are required:

	<b>1</b> Using the DRDP (2015) for Special Education – Infant/Toddler		<b>2</b> Benny Having a Snack
<b>-or-</b> Using the DRDP (2015) for Special Education – Preschool			<b>3</b> Using DR Access Reports

The courses will appear in the assessors account one at a time. Once a course is completed, the next one will become available.

Assessors must complete the DRDP for all eligible children *regardless* of course completion status. SELPA Directors will receive training status reports throughout the year.

## **OVERVIEW**

The East Valley Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA) coordinates special education services for more than 10,000 special education students within five school districts, including Colton Joint Unified, Redlands Unified, Rialto Unified, Rim of the World Unified, Yucaipa-Calimesa Joint Unified, plus San Bernardino County Schools-East Valley Student Services. The districts have joined together to ensure that students with disabilities are provided appropriate educational services in the least restrictive environment.

The Superintendents from each of the districts and the County Schools Student Services Assistant Superintendent form the Board of Directors of the East Valley SELPA. The Board oversees the implementation of the Special Education Local Plan and gives direction and supervision to the SELPA Administrator.

Personnel in the East Valley SELPA are a resource to all staff members and parents within the member districts. Responsibilities of all SELPA personnel follow the guidelines established by the Board of Directors.

## **ADMINISTRATION**

***Patty Metheny, Ed.D., SELPA Chief Administrative Officer***

The SELPA Chief Administrative Officer is responsible for developing and implementing procedures in accordance with the Board of Directors' policies. Other responsibilities include:

- Serving as the Executive Secretary to the Board of Directors
- Serving as chairperson of SELPA Steering Committee
- Facilitating the SELPA Community Advisory Committee
- Developing and implementing operating procedures
- Coordinating regionalized services
- Developing annual income and expenditure budgets for the SELPA
- Coordinating professional development opportunities
- Developing interagency agreements
- Facilitating the provision of fee-for-service programs
- Ensuring procedural safeguards and due process rights
- Coordinating services via the Transition Partnership Program
- Representing the SELPA at local, regional and state meetings

## **DUE PROCESS**

***Rick Homutoff, Ed.D., Program Manager***

The Program Manager for due process serves professional staff, parents, students and administrators and is under the direction and supervision of the SELPA Administrator. Working with a representative from each participating district or agency, the Program Manager coordinates activities related to procedural safeguards and due process functions. Responsibilities include:

- Investigating complaints regarding special education programs
- Assisting districts in mediations and fair hearings
- Working with attorneys to represent districts
- Providing information on state and federal law
- Representing SELPA at local, regional and state meetings
- Providing exemplary program information
- Providing in-services to district personnel
- Acting as a resource at Individual Education Program (IEP) team meetings

## **REGIONAL SERVICES**

***Jennifer Brooksby, M.S., Program Manager***

The Program Manager for regional services supports member districts by working with representative from each participating district or agency as well as SELPA and state personnel to coordinate activities related to compliance and procedural practices. Responsibilities include:

- Assisting districts with compliance review preparation and activities
- Providing oversight for students placed in nonpublic schools
- Facilitating inter-district and inter-SELPA transfers
- Facilitating professional collaboration groups
- Revising SELPA policies and procedures handbook
- Reviewing and revising SELPA forms to comply with state and federal law
- Representing SELPA at local, regional and state meetings

## **BEHAVIORAL HEALTH**

***Tracy Schroeder, M.A., Program Manager***

The Program Manager for behavioral health oversees the provision of educationally related mental health services and supports the provision of other direct services provided by the SELPA. Responsibilities include:

- Administers the operations of the Behavioral Health program
- Collaborates with private and public agencies including school districts and community agencies;
- Conducts assessments and provides oversight of residentially placed students
- Coordinates in-home behavioral/social work services for students
- Reviews program budget and staffing;
- Trains and supervises staff.



## **FISCAL SERVICES**

***Andrea Tennyson, SELPA Consultant***

Under the supervision of the SELPA Administrator, the SELPA Consultant is responsible for coordinating the fiscal procedures and functions of the SELPA and acts in an advisory capacity to the districts regarding special education funding. Areas of responsibilities include:

- Special education funding
- Management Information System for special education students
- Fiscal planning and compliance
- Budget development and implementation
- State reporting (fiscal and program/student)
- Service areas are Pupil Count (including Federal Quota & Deaf/blind registry), Grants, Low Incidence, and the Transition Partnership Project)

## **SELPA SUPPORT SERVICES**

The East Valley SELPA provides support to member districts in the following areas:

Special education funding

- Student data maintenance and support
- Nonpublic school and agency contract development, individual service agreements, billing, monitoring
- Professional development scheduling and facilitating
- Low Incidence equipment procurement and processing
- Due process and complaints
- Referral processing and follow-up

## **STAFF DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITIES**

The East Valley SELPA offers a spectrum of training activities at a variety of levels designed to match learners' needs with program offerings.

It is the belief of East Valley SELPA that:

- Effective staff development programs recognize principles of adult learning and the continuous professional competence and commitment of all employees.
- Participation in professional development enhances professional effectiveness.
- Staff development is most effective in bringing about change when programs are on-going and there is ample opportunity for follow-up.
- Needs identified by various constituent groups and individuals are the basis for designing staff development activities and trainings.
- Commitment to implement planned change is built through collaboration and communication.

## PROGRAM SPECIALISTS

To efficiently meet the needs of each district in the East Valley SELPA, the Program Specialists serve as a resource to administrators, general education teachers, special education teachers, related services personnel, students and parents, and are under the direction and supervision of the SELPA Administrator. The services they provide include:

**Behavior Intervention:** develop, together with the teacher and student, behavior support plans for specific students

**Core Curriculum:** assist in developing and/or adapting the core curriculum to meet the changing needs of special education individuals in the classroom

**IEP Meetings:** serve as a resource person for IEP teams in development of IEP goals and objectives

**Instructional Techniques:** demonstrate specific instructional techniques or the use of specific materials

**Inclusion/Collaboration:** give assistance to teachers, parents and students in providing integration of special education students into regular education classrooms or into the community

**Observation:** observe or provide informal assessment of students about whom school personnel have serious concerns

**General Education Students with Special Needs:** provide strategies and materials to use with the child who does not qualify for special education services

**Specialized Materials:** assist in locating or preparing specialized materials for students with unique problems

**Training:** provide training to regular and special education teachers, instructional aides, administrators and parents on a variety of topics based on specific needs or requests

**Transition:** assist in planning for students at all levels who are preparing for transition from formal education to adult life

## ITINERANT STAFF

Itinerant staff provide direct assistance to administrators, individual teachers, support staff, parents, and students as requested. Itinerant staff work in the following service areas:

### ***School-Based Occupational & Physical Therapy***

- Provide occupational therapy assessment & consultation for children 3-22 years of age in special education as part of a multidisciplinary team
- Evaluate abnormal patterns of posture & movement
- Assist teachers in developing functional fine motor goals for the IEP.
- Provide school-based, short-term occupational therapy

### ***Educationally Related Mental Health Services***

- Evaluate need for school-based mental health services
- Provide individual in-school counseling and residential monitoring
- Collateral contact with teachers and parents
- Social Work Services: case-manager services (TBS, Success First)

### ***Transition Partnership Project***

- Partner with the Department of Rehabilitation and SELPA member districts to support employment for special education high school seniors and recent graduates
- Work with local employers to access and support student work experience and long term employment

The Structured Observations of Sensory Integration-Motor (SOSI-M) &  
The Comprehensive Observations of Proprioception (COP-R):  
Administration, Scoring and Interpretation in School-Based Practice

Clinical observations have been utilized in sensory integration assessment for a long time. However, a significant amount of variation in administration and interpretation poses a challenge for clinicians in the field. The SOSI-M and the COP-R are two nationally standardized assessments of sensory motor integration that allow clinicians to accurately identify and interpret sensory-motor issues linked to sensory processing and integration. This course will focus on the administration, scoring, and interpretation of results obtained with the SOSI-M and COP-R when used in conjunction with other assessment tools. Participants will learn to apply the results obtained with these tools to plan treatment goals and treatment strategies. Cases will be utilized to illustrate the value of the SOSI-M and COP-R as outcome measures. This course consists of 2 parts. Part 1: Participants will earn 8 CEUs (8 contact hours). Part 1 consists of an asynchronous, online component in which the participants learn the theoretical background of the SOSI-M and COP-R, their administration and scoring. A score of 75% or higher on a multiple-choice exam is required to pass part 1 of the course and earn CEUs. Part 2: In-person workshop December 1, 2023, 8:30 am - 4:00 pm. Participants will earn 7 CEUs (7 contact hours) Completion of Part 1 is a requirement for Part 2. Part 2 is a one-day, in-person workshop that will focus on interpretation & analysis, treatment planning and the use of the SOSI-M and COP-R as outcome measures. 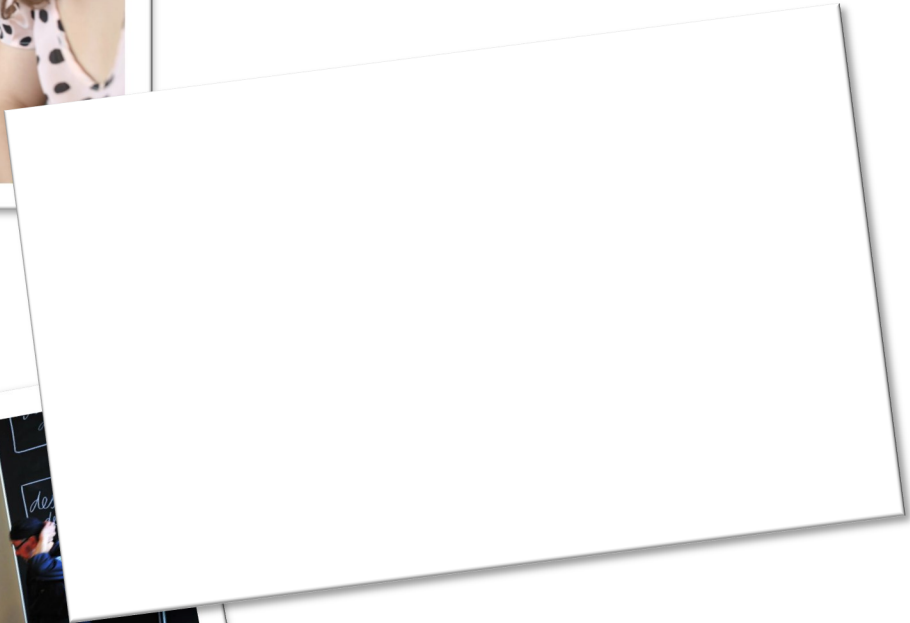

## AAC IN THE CLASSROOM

This training is an introduction to Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) for teachers, paraprofessionals, Speech-Language Pathologists, and others who work within the classroom setting.

*Through lecture and interactive activities, we will cover many objectives, including:*

- The guiding principals of AAC and its forms
- Core and fringe vocabularies
- How to model communication for an AAC learner
- Engineering the classroom for visual communication
- Planning and integrating AAC throughout the day
- Selecting vocabulary and creating a lesson plan
- Team collaboration for success
- Resources for communication systems, activities, and lesson plans

*This training is an overview of AAC and focuses on in-person classroom implementation of basic visual AAC. It does NOT cover assessment or programming of high tech devices or their systems.*

## TODAY'S ABA

“Out with the Old and in with the New: Today’s ABA”

Recent conversations with autistic adults have provoked some change in the delivery of Applied Behavior Analysis and practices. Today’s ABA is still focused on evidence-based practices and developing student skills to improve social skills, academic skills and overall daily living and well-being. Today’s ABA will focus on how to create joy during training sessions and how to empower students to lead their engagement and interaction with others.

*Objectives include:*

- Today’s ABA vs. Yesterday’s ABA
- Definition and Facts about ABA
- The ABC Contingency
- Functions of Behavior
- Reinforcers and their Principles
- ABA Teaching Strategies
- Definition and Components of Discrete Trail Training
- Data Collection

## ADULT TRANSITION PROGRAM (ATP) AND LOCAL PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT (LPA)

### TRANSITION SERIES

ATP Information Meetings: These meetings are intended to provide parents and educational staff with information about secondary and post-secondary programs and service options available to their students. Representatives from agencies that support transition for post-secondary education, job skills training and employment will share information about their programs. Visits to the agency sites are arranged, when possible, to see where clients report to begin their program day and observe program activities in action if occurring at that location.

LPA Meetings: LPA Members and attendees are comprised of School District representatives working with transition-age students, Inland Regional Center (IRC), transition support staff, the Department of Rehabilitation (DOR), the Workforce Development Department (WDD), Adult Services Agencies, and interested Parents. These meetings provide updates from each agency and scheduled guest speakers to inform the LPA Members about activities conducted and services provided that streamline the transition of individuals into post-secondary life for employment, education and training, and community living experiences.

## POSITIVE BEHAVIOR INTERVENTIONS

This training focuses on using positive behavior interventions to assist teachers with managing behavior challenges. Participants will leave with strategies to implement immediately in their respective settings.

*The following behavioral principles will be introduced:*

- ABCs and functions of behavior
- Reinforcement and Reinforce systems
- Visual Supports & other tools to manage behavior
- Building rapport with students
- Sensory strategies
- Data collection

## FUNCTIONAL BEHAVIOR ASSESSMENT (FBA) & BEHAVIOR INTERVENTION PLAN (BIP)

This training covers the core components of both an effective and comprehensive FBA and resulting BIP.

### *Participants will:*

- Learn the three main components of a legally defensible FBA which include Indirect Assessment, Direct Assessment and Analysis of data to determine the function of the behavior. This information comes directly from researched literature on ABA
- Learn how to develop interventions specific to the function of the behavior identified for change. This will include staff instructions, teaching strategies, visual supports and crisis intervention procedures in order to decrease identified behavior and increase the use of the new positive behavior (FERB)
- Become familiar with the EV SELPA process of collecting data, analyzing the information and developing a plan
- Become proficient with how to effectively analyze data by using the forms developed by EV SELPA
- Gain knowledge of the appropriate steps in developing a comprehensive and legally compliant Functional Behavior Assessment (FBA) and Behavior Intervention Plan (BIP) by using the EV SELPA FBA and BIP Guidebooks

## SELF-DETERMINATION STUDENT IEP PARTICIPANTION

Exercises that foster student self-awareness to enable their greater inclusivity at IEP Meetings through participation in self-advocacy and self-determination activities. Student-led IEPs exist on a continuum from minimal student involvement to student leadership throughout the process. Students at every grade level are capable of participating in some form in the process of defining their education pan. By helping to create and implement their IEPs, students become better advocates for themselves and take greater ownership over their learning. Consequently, they are more likely to stay invested in their education and achieve their educational goals.

## SUCCESSFUL IEP MEETINGS

**Audience:** Administrators, Site Administrators, special education teachers, general education teachers, direct service providers

The audience will understand key components of an effective IEP meeting. Information about which participants are required to attend a scheduled IEP, and the role of each participant during and after the meeting will be presented.

Included will be information on presenting meeting guidelines as well as a well-organized agenda for the team members at an IEP. Participants will view a recorded mock IEP meeting with individuals modeling meeting protocol for each of their roles.

## DEVELOPING STUDENT-CENTERED & LEGALLY COMPLIANT IEP GOALS

### Participants will:

- Learn how to develop legally compliant IEP goals using a 13-part template
- Learn how to collect data on IEP Goals, know as Progress Monitoring
- Learn how to effectively implement all parts of an IEP
- Receive a goal bank to reference and help support future goal development
- Be able to identify significant parts of an effective IEP goal
- Be able to use an IEP Goal Template to guide the development or check the accuracy of current IEP goals
- Demonstrate knowledge of current grade level and functional grade level to develop appropriate goals, known as Backward Mapping
- Be able to define Progress Monitoring and how it relates to IEP development
- Practice completing progress monitoring sheets and develop new sheets based on current and future IEP goals
- Continue creating the goal bank and matching the goals to the correct progress monitoring sheets
- Understand all the areas for implantation in an IEP
- Learn to use the conditions of intervention as a guide for target skill instruction
- Learn how to collect data while instructing the target skill

## SOCIAL SKILLS (NEURODIVERSITY APPROACH)

This training will provide strategies for effective interactions among all students.

### Training objectives:

- Understand the importance of authentic communication practices that serve a valuable function to the individual exhibiting them, rather than attempting to extinguish and replace these behaviors
- Understanding that both non-verbal communication and verbal communication serve a purpose for determining student's needs and wants
- Learn that differences in first-person perspectives affect behavior and communication between neurotypical and neurodiverse individuals
- Take away strategies for application in the classroom that include story book and movie review, video modeling, role play, and games

## THE PARAPROFESSIONAL

This training will cover necessary information to truly support teachers teach and students learn daily. It will have valuable information for newly hired paraprofessionals and those who have been assisting teachers and students for years. We will cover ways to implement instructional support in academic, social, and behavioral areas. Paraprofessionals will walk away with new strategies, and tips and tricks to add to their “tool boxes”.

### *Participants will:*

- Learn the different responsibilities of a paraprofessional across the continuum of placements
- Understand how to support students academically, socially, and behaviorally while focusing on student independence
- Gain knowledge of special education, Individualized Education Programs (IEPs), accommodations and modifications
- Learn how to take accurate data
- Learn how to work with others

## 1:1 ASSESSMENT

### “STEPPING UP FROM SCIA: ASSESSING THE NEED FOR 1:1 SUPPORT”

Participants will be introduced to the New Additional Support Assessment process to evaluate and identify the need for additional student supports including individual paraprofessional support. Attendees will understand each of the 7 steps of the ASA to thoroughly assess all aspects of the student’s program to determine whether extra support is needed. Participants will receive many resources to conduct interviews, complete observations, collect data, and summarize assessment results in a comprehensive and sequenced manner. This training also covers the generation of an aide training and fading plan when paraprofessional support is indicated.

## CAPTAIN AND EBPs

Improve your knowledge about Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and learn about effective strategies to use with both younger and older students on the spectrum. This training provides an overview of Evidence-Based Practices (EBPs) for ASD as identified by the National Clearinghouse on Autism Evidence & Practice (NCAEP). In addition, the participant is introduced to the California Autism Professional Training and Information Network (CAPTAIN), a state-wide initiative dedicated to the dissemination of EBPs for ASD. The participant will walk away with a thorough understanding of why EBPs are paramount to the success of students with ASD and learn where to locate immediate resources for planning and implementation of EBPs in educational settings.

## STRUCTURING THE CLASSROOM FOR STUDENT SUCCESS

This training is for teachers, paraeducators, and administrators in any stage of their career, who would like to learn more about effective, well-run classrooms based on evidence-based practices.

*Topics covered will be:*

- Environmental setup (schedules, labeled materials, furniture)
- Procedures across all environments (whole group, small group, independent work)
- The use of program binders (IEP, work samples, staff instructions, lesson plans, progress monitoring)
- Creating effective behavior programs with strong reinforcement systems where rules and consequences are prominently posted and precision requests are taught and used throughout the day
- Managing your staff team using productive communication and ongoing feedback strategies so that roles and responsibilities are clear and foster positive teamwork within your program
- Learn the difference between sensory and behavior strategies throughout the training

## NEURODIVERSITY

The Neurodiversity 'Growth' Paradigm embraces individuals having cognitive and behavioral differences as normal variations in our natural world. Neurodiversity aligns with the practices of the Inclusion Movement and should be represented in diversity lessons and educational equity policies.

*This training will include the following topics and activities:*

- Neurodiversity affirming language
- Interactive activities providing perspective about how neurodivergent individuals feel complying with neurotypical behavior expectations
- Videos portraying the Neurodivergent Point-of-view
- Classroom strategies
- Neurodiversity affirming goals
- Bidirectional/'Double Empathy' perspective training
- Acceptance training for neurotypicals
- Teaching figurative language
- Teaching Interoception-awareness of one's internal feelings relative to their emotional state of being

## INCLUSION SERIES

### COLLABORATIVE SUPPORT FOR INCLUSION AND CO-TEACHING

INCLUSION is a belief that everybody belongs. Most of us have been implementing inclusion in this way for a very long time, based on individual student needs. Students can receive direct services indicated on their IEP, within their general education class or in an alternative environment. As we look at FULL INCLUSION, we become more intentional about EVERY student with an IEP remaining in their general education classroom with all of their needed services being delivered within that setting.

CO-TEACHING is an active instructional model that utilizes two or more certified educators sharing instructional responsibility to provide joint accountability for curriculum and special services. This is done through delivering specially designed instruction through various adaptations to the content, methodology or delivery of instruction. In this way, there is incidental benefit to non-disabled students who are being educated in the same educational setting.

*This training will be developed to meet the needs of each district at the stage of inclusion that is needed:*

- INCLUSION as a general belief
  - What do we know about inclusion?
  - What have been historical practices?
- FULL INCLUSION
  - Placement decision of individual students by the IEP team
  - Support services delivered to the individual student
  - Accommodating and Modifying curriculum as needed for the individual
- CO-TEACHING
  - Understanding the framework for co-teaching:
    - Preparation and School culture
    - Organization
    - Collaboration
    - Time to Co-Plan for Instruction
  - Pre-planned instructional strategies
  - Accommodating the needs of all students
  - Behavioral supports to aid in integration
